Dear Ms. Sasamoto-Schmer:

This letter is written to advise you that the denial of reaccreditation of Intercultural Communications College by the Accrediting Commission of the Accrediting Council for Continuing Education & Training (ACCET) is now a final action. A letter was sent to the institution on December 24, 2011, received on December 27, 2010, informing you of the decision to deny accreditation to the institution, with the opportunity to appeal if received within 15 days of receipt, in accordance with ACCET policy. No appeal has been received as of this date; therefore, the institution's decision not to seek an appeal exhausts the available administrative remedies provided by the Commission and makes this action final. The institution may submit an official comment for posting with regard to the Commission's decision, provided it is received within 15 days of receipt of this letter.

Since the accredited status previously held with ACCET is now withdrawn, the institution must take timely steps to insure that any website references, brochures, catalogs, advertisements, letterhead, certificates or other documentation used by the institution, which makes reference to ACCET and/or the institution's prior accredited status with this agency, are corrected, removed from circulation or destroyed, including **return of the previously issued ACCET certificate of accreditation** to this office, **no later than January 28, 2011.**

As a closing note, it remains our hope that the accreditation process has served to focus the institution's resources and commitment towards strengthening its operations through the systematic and effective implementation of policies and practices that ensure the highest levels of quality and integrity.
